Notes on Each Exam, Spring 2010

Exam One: It will be composed of three sets of questions: 1. from the reading; 2. from the lecture; 3. from hell. The points will add to 25, roughly evenly divided over the 3 sections (remember that if you make a perfect score on 1 and 2 and screw up 3 as badly as you possibly can, then you will still earn a low B).

Exam Two: It will (again) be composed of three sets of questions: 1. from the reading; 2. from the lecture; 3. from hell. The points will add to 25, roughly evenly divided over the 3 sections (remember that if you make a perfect score on 1 and 2 and screw up 3 as badly as you possibly can, then you will still earn a low B).

You are responsible for questions 15, 17-30 (don't forget that 24 became 24a and 24b!), 63-69, and 79-84.

The points will add to 30, roughly evenly divided over the 3 sections (remember that if you make a perfect score on 1 and 2 and screw up 3 as badly as you possibly can, then you will still earn a low B).
